





NEWS FROM THE OFFICE

February is here and Spring is now one month closer.

The 2026 annual assessment of \$68 was now due and payable by January 31. A \$15 Late fee for delinquent 2026 Annual Dues will be placed on accounts during the first week of February.

First week of March constitutes a 60-day delinquent Second Notice and an additional late fee of \$35 will be placed on the account.

At 90 days delinquent, the property owner will be sent an “Intent to Lien” notice and a collection fee of \$50 will be charged to the account.

At 120 days delinquent, if an Owner fails to pay in full the amount covered by an Intent to Lien Notice by the date specified, a written Notice of Lien will be prepared and recorded with the County Recorder pursuant to A.R.S. 33-1807. A lien fee of \$100 will be charged to the Owners account.

As you can see, a simple \$68 annual assessment can turn into hundreds of dollars and ruin your credit. If you are unsure whether you are or are not current, give me a call.

Yavapai County is a “Dark Sky” County as outlined in the Yavapai County Planning and Zoning Ordinance Section 603. If you would like to comply with the dark sky ordinance, you may remove your obsolete exterior light fixtures or place a shield over them so the light shines downward not outward. You can purchase new fixtures that are fully shielded to meet the requirements of the ordinance. Flood lights do not meet the code. Motion lights are acceptable as long as they don’t infringe on your neighbors, and they turn off after a few minutes. I know everyone living here wants to be a good neighbor, so please check your lighting and make the necessary changes so as not to disturb your neighbors with bright lights. If you need to contact the Dark Sky Division of Yavapai County, you can call 928-771-3464 and leave a request for a property address check by a code enforcement officer. Your call can be anonymous.

Just a reminder, overnight parking is not allowed at the POA building’s asphalt parking lot. If someone wants to park in the gravel lot please come to the office to fill in a “Parking Permit.”



Valentine's Celebration Throughout the Years

Valentine's Day started out as the ancient Roman festival of Lupercalia, a fertility festival dedicated to the Roman god of agriculture and celebrated on February 15th. As part of the festival, unmarried women placed their names in a large urn. Bachelors drew a name and were paired with that woman for the rest of the year. These pairings often lead to marriage.

Lupercalia was deemed "Christian" in the fifth century when Pope Gelasius declared February 14th St.

Valentine's Day. During the Middle Ages, both the French and the British believed February 14th was the beginning of birds' mating season which added to the idea it was a day of romance. Geoffrey Chaucer was the first to associate St. Valentine's Day with romantic love in his 1375 poem "Parliament of Foules."

By the middle of the 18th century, it was common for friends and lovers to exchange small tokens of af-

fection or handwritten notes. By 1900, printed cards began to replace written letters and chocolates and jewelry became popular gifts. As time went on, gifts were given not only to further romance but also to any loved one and became more elaborate to showcase the depth of affection.

What has remained constant throughout the ages are the colors of Valentine's. Red is the color of energy, love and passion. Pink signals affection, understanding and sweetness. For this reason, Valentine's jewelry often contains red or pink stones, such as ruby, garnet or rose quartz. But there are other gemstones also thought to attract love and increase passion such as:

Know Before You Go: Smart Planning for Your Home Purchase

If you're planning to buy a home, wouldn't it be helpful to know your estimated monthly payment and how much cash you'll need to close before you start touring properties? Most buyers agree this information is essential early on, yet many are surprised to learn that a lender is not required to provide a formal Loan Estimate until a full loan application is submitted, which includes a property address.

So how can you prepare ahead of time?

The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) offers a helpful resource called "Your Home Loan Toolkit." This guide includes worksheets designed to help you define a realistic budget and take inventory of the funds you have available for a purchase. Once you understand what you're comfortable spending, the next step is working with a knowledgeable professional who can walk you through the loan options available to you.

When choosing a lender, it's important to ask the right questions. Do they offer multiple loan programs?

For example, if you're eligible for VA benefits, you should be shown both VA and conventional loan options so you can compare. You'll also want to confirm whether the lender finances condominiums or manufactured homes, since not all property types qualify for all loan programs. Real estate is not "one size fits all."

Another key point: some lenders charge application or

prequalification fees. In Arizona, a prequalification is required when making an offer on a home, so it's important to understand any costs upfront.

Once you've selected a lender and provided the necessary information, be sure to discuss both your estimated monthly payment and your total cash needed to close. Lenders often share the maximum amount you qualify for, but that number may be significantly higher than what fits comfortably within your personal budget. Qualification and affordability are not always the same thing.

If you take the time to review the Home Loan Toolkit closely, you'll see that the responsibility ultimately rests with the buyer to know what they can afford and whether they have sufficient funds for the transaction. A lender's primary role is to confirm that your goals are achievable and that you meet the guidelines for the loan.

While online tools and calculators can provide general education, they cannot determine what you truly qualify for or which loan programs you're eligible to use. That can only be confirmed by a licensed mortgage professional.


