NEWS FROM THE OFFICE

Happy August everyone!

August is the perfect time to take yourself outside and look up at the night sky and the abundance of stars that can be seen.

Yavapai County is home to some of the darkest skies in the Southwest. This resource is protected through the Yavapai County Dark Sky Ordinance Rules.

Yavapai County's outdoor lighting code is found under Section 1101 of the Yavapai County Planning and Zoning Ordinance. The important parts of this ordinance include outdoor fixtures that must be fully shielded meaning the light source is not visible from above or the side and the light is directed downward (not directed to your neighbors' home). This Ordinance applies to street lights, security lights, porch lights, and signage lighting.

For example, residential lights must be 3000K or lower which converts to 30 or 40 watts. A 40 watt, warm white or amber LED light bulb will reduce blue light emissions, which are particularly harmful to night vision and the ecosystem. Therefore, for residential use, a 30-40 watt warm white or amber LED lightbulb will comply with the ordinance.

There are several benefits to following the Dark Sky Ordinance:

- 1) You can enjoy pristine views of the Milky Way and meteor showers as you sit on your deck or patio enjoying a glass of wine.
- 2) The nocturnal animals, who depend on natural darkness for navigation and breeding, will thank you by having their offspring on your property.
- 3) You will save money on your electric bill because you are reducing light waste.
- 4) The neighbors around you will be very thankful that less glare and light trespass from your property will improve their sleep and quality of life.

AND, most importantly, I will be happy to not be swamped with calls from sleep deprived residents!

Computers and the Arizona Heat: PROTECTING YOUR TECHNOLOGY IN EXTREME TEMPERATURES

Living in Arizona offers beautiful sunshine, stunning landscapes, and mild winters, but the intense summer heat can create serious challenges for computers and other electronic devices. When temperatures regularly climb near 100 degrees, protecting your technology becomes more important than ever.

Computers generate heat naturally during operation. Processors, graphics cards, and storage devices all produce heat as they work. Under normal conditions, cooling fans and ventilation systems remove this heat to keep components operating safely. However, Arizona's extreme temperatures can make it much harder for these cooling systems to do their job effectively.

One of the biggest risks occurs when computers are left in vehicles. The temperature inside a parked car can quickly exceed 140 degrees, even on a moderately warm day. Exposure to these temperatures can damage batteries, screens, hard drives, and other sensitive electronic components. Whenever possible, avoid leaving laptops, tablets, or other devices in your vehicle.

Home offices and workspaces can also become problematic if air conditioning systems struggle to keep up with the heat. Computers perform best when room temperatures remain within the manufacturer's recommended range. If your workspace feels hot and uncomfortable, your computer is likely feeling the effects as well.

Dust is another common issue in Arizona. Dust storms, dry conditions, and everyday desert dust can accumulate inside computers, blocking airflow and reducing cooling efficiency. Regular maintenance, including cleaning vents and fans with compressed air, can significantly improve performance and reduce overheating risks.

Laptop users should pay particular attention to airflow. Avoid placing laptops on beds, couches, or blankets

where ventilation openings can become blocked. A hard surface or cooling pad can help maintain proper airflow and lower operating temperatures.

Signs of heat-related problems include unusually loud fans, sluggish performance, freezing, unexpected shutdowns, and error messages. Addressing these symptoms early can help prevent costly repairs.

With a little preventative maintenance and awareness, Arizona residents can keep their computers running reliably throughout the hottest months of the year. Protecting your technology from extreme heat helps ensure better performance, longer equipment life, and fewer unexpected interruptions when you need your computer most.

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What we can expect to see from the new Housing Act?

On June 23, 2026, the 21st Century ROAD to Housing Act was passed and 10 days later it became law.

Some features of the Act are being immediately implemented. Affordable housing projects that have been in the pipeline awaiting approval because of onerous environmental inspections, have been given the green light to break ground without extensive red tape, which will save hundreds of thousands of dollars on the project cost not to mention getting housing to those who need it faster.

A key feature of the housing bill that will benefit our area start with the changes made to the requirements for manufactured homes, most notable removing the need for a permanent chassis.

This will reduce not only the cost to construct the home by as much as 10% but it should also reduce the cost to ship the home to the site and reduce the cost to set the home on the foundation.

Another key feature of the housing act is the establishment of a homeowner and repair Grant program. This program is designed to assist low-income homeowners with structural repairs and deferred maintenance.

At the state and local level, pilot programs and grants

will be in place to encourage local governments to loosen restrictive land use zoning to promote affordable housing. This along with the streamlined approval process for HUD approved projects will reduce overall construction costs and bring the projects online faster.

A lot of what is in this Act will benefit cities such as Phoenix and Tucson. We can expect to see in the next 1 to 2 years, empty office buildings being converted to housing units with the help of a pilot program specifically designed to provide money to local governments for these projects.

Revitalization of existing buildings will bring housing online at record speed. This along with an improved Section 8 application and approval process will get people in need into housing within weeks of making an application for housing verses months under the current system.

While in my opinion, it remains the responsibility of local businesses and government to solve our housing affordability problem, I am hopeful that if our Federal tax dollars are allocated wisely, the quality of housing in our area will improve and become attainable for more Arizonans, especially our Senior and Veteran communities.

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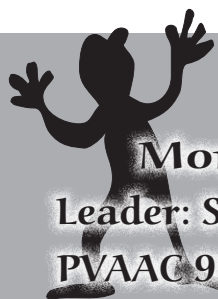
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To The Residents of PCC.

PLEASE ATTEND the August 5th public hearing by the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors in their meeting room, first floor, 1015 Fair Street, Prescott AZ 86305.
